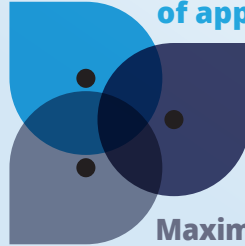

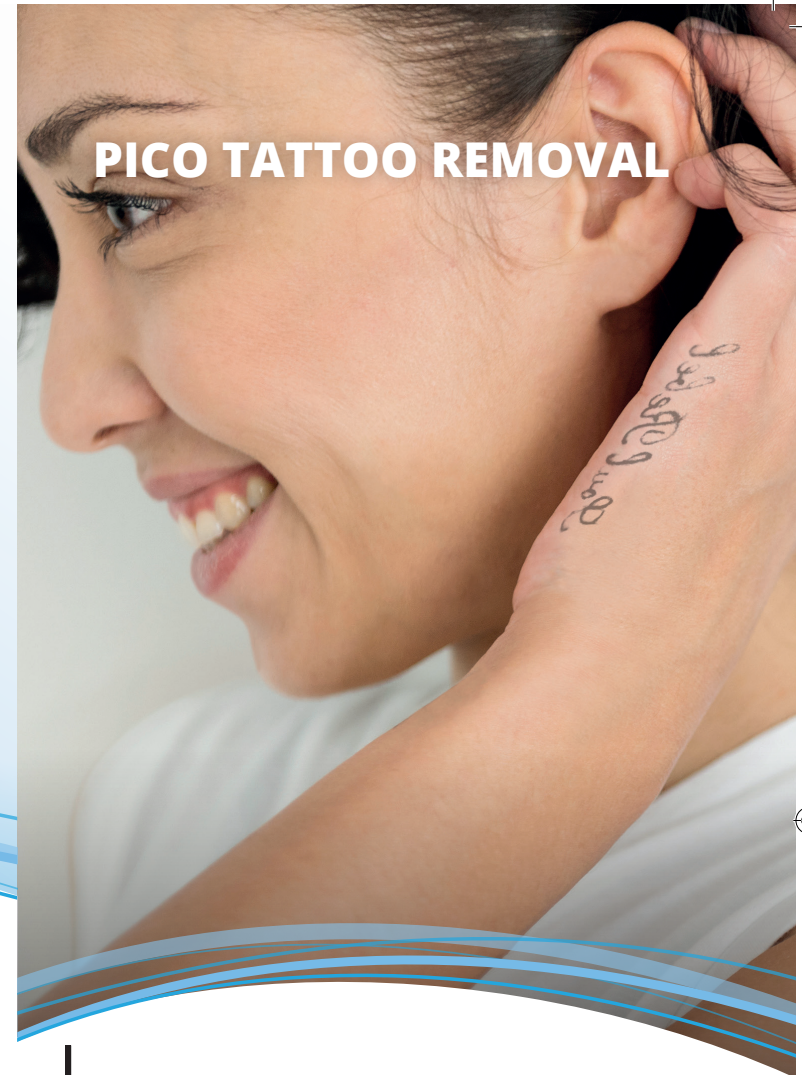

Maximum Efficacy For Tattoo Removal Treatment

SmartPICO is an advanced laser system by Lynton that features a combination of 4 different emissions and is one of the most flexible devices on the market. As well as tattoo removal, it can treat a range of concerns including dyschromia, pigmented lesions, melasma and post-inflammatory hyperpigmentation, with minimal contraindications.



Who's this treatment for?

This treatment is for anyone who wants to fully or partially remove a tattoo on any part of the body.

Is it uncomfortable?

The treatment is well-tolerated by most patients. It feels like mild blows from a rubber band on the skin.

What do I have to do beforehand?

Avoid sun exposure and tanning beds/lamps for at least one month prior to treatment. The skin has to be clean and free of cosmetics. Additionally, medication that could also alter light sensitivity must be avoided.

How many treatments are necessary?

Most patients require 4-8 sessions spaced at least two months apart. However, the number of treatments can vary based on various factors such as phototype, ink colour and the age of the tattoo and its location.

What do I have to do afterwards?

In most cases, a white veil develops for about 20 minutes; this is known as 'frosting'. It is followed by swelling and redness that can last for 2-3 days. Small blisters and mild bleeding can occur in rare cases. Should this happen, patients will be given specific aftercare advice.

What effects can I expect?

Over a few weeks, a series of changes can be seen. Firstly, the ink will start to fade and some areas of the skin will become slightly lighter. These changes will be progressive and pigment will fade further after every treatment. The skin will return to its natural colour in a few months. Final results will be visible a few months after the last laser session.
